From the Preacher's Pen

New Beginnings

As I write this today delegates from around the world are gathered in Charlotte, North Carolina for our long-awaited General Conference. This meeting should have taken place in 2020 (General Conference gathers every four years) but the Covid-19 pandemic caused it to be postponed several times. Finally, it has begun.

If the conference had been held in 2020 it's highly likely that the carefully negotiated Protocol for Separation would have passed. That would have issued in a more peaceable disaffiliation process and prevented much of the pain that the Church has endured through 2023. With postponement of General Conference, the Wesleyan Covenant Association abandoned the Protocol and launched the Global Methodist Church causing anger, chaos and division.

Now, however, the time has arrived for a sweeping renewal of the United Methodist Church. Just as new life arrives with the coming of Spring and the Easter season, new Life has begun for the UMC. Hope and joy surrounds this gathering in Charlotte. There is a very real sense that the Holy Spirit is doing a new thing in our denomination.

Delegates are certainly faced with some serious decisions and there will be some difficult choices. Our budget will decrease by nearly 43 percent. Central Conferences outside of the United States are proposing a new structure called Regionalization in which all areas of the church throughout the world will finally be treated as equals. Since the 1968 meager U.S. concerns have dominated General Conference legislation and discussion. By moving to regions much of the concerns of the U.S. church could be dealt with on a regional basis freeing General Conference to more effectively deal with global concerns.

Delegates will also be voting on new Social Principles. Members around the world have been working for twelve years to revise and perfect this foundational document. The Social Principles have been part of the Methodist Church since 1908 and have guided generations of Methodists in dealing with issues facing society. The Social Principles are grounded in scripture and are vital to our witness in the world.

In Isaiah 43:19 God proclaims: "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland." The Holy Spirit is doing a new and exciting thing in the United Methodist Church all over the world. General Conference 2024 is the springtime of new life and Pentecost joy!


